

Kindergarten

We have had an amazing month in Kindergarten! We have learned all about sight words, rhyming words, syllables, numbers, and counting. We have also learned about Thanksgiving and talked about things we are thankful for. We are working hard to meet our goals this year! Remember, each student is working to learn 100 Sight Words. If you haven't received your list, please let us know! Each student is also



working towards our goal of counting to 100 by 1 and 10. Thanks for working with us to help each child achieve their goals! We are looking forward to an amazing month and year to come

1st Grade

We would like to give you some insight into what we are working on in the classroom in order for you to best support your student at home. *In Math* we are currently working on fluency in addition and subtraction within 10. We also are beginning to discuss single step story and picture problems to 10 as well.



For example: 5 big dogs are at the park. 3 Little dogs join them. How many dogs are at the park in all? Your student should be able to recognize this as an addition problem and be able to draw a model and solve it successfully on their own. Please continue to review at home. *In Reading*, we are currently working on fiction and non-fiction text and text features. Please continue to work on Dolch words nightly. There is a direct correlation between sight word acquisition and reading fluency. In addition, please read with your child for at least 20 minutes a night. This does not need to be independent reading, simply reading to them for pleasure will

encourage their love of reading and success in the classroom. The homework will continue to be a monthly calendar that also lists the weekly spelling words.

2nd Grade

In December for 2nd grade we will be continuing with Estimating in *Math*. For *Writing*, please continue to work on writing complete sentences, formulating paragraphs, and writing with detail using the five senses. In *Reading*, we will be discussing Expository Non-fiction. We will also be using this genre to make and confirm predictions and review character, setting, and plot.



In *Science*, we will be looking at forces of motion and how they affect our daily lives with a focus on magnet strength. In *Social Studies*, we will be starting geography and will be able to identify different components/places on a map. Lastly, continue to read for 20 minutes each night and check Class Dojo at least 3 times a week



3rd Grade

In *Science*, the students have been learning about different animal adaptations and determining if they are a physical or behavioral adaptation. In *Math*, the students have been working creating and analyzing graphs. The students have been conducting their own survey's and collected data to create a pictograph or bar graph. For *Reading*, the students have been working on identifying the theme, comparing and contrasting, character traits of fairy tale stories. Please continue to have your child read nightly. For *Social Studies*, the students have been analyzing photographs from Egypt and pulling information from photo to develop an understanding of Ancient Egypt.



4th Grade

The month of December proves to be a busy time for all. We will be learning about graphing, probability, electricity, the Thirteen Colonies, as well as narrative non-fiction and functional text for reading. Ms. Bollman's class will be performing in the winter concert on December 17. Please continue to check your child's grades in Synergy and encourage them to get their work completed and turned in.

5th Grade


In December, 5th graders will continue to study life in colonial Virginia. Students will also begin studying the Revolutionary War and Virginia's role during this era. In reading, students

will continue working on a variety of reading skills including identifying the main idea, using context clues to understand unknown words, and making inferences while reading. Please encourage your child to read 20 minutes each night. Nonfiction text has been a difficult genre for fifth graders- encourage your child to find a book on a topic that interests them! Also ask your child about our daily vocabulary word and what it means. We have been busy building and testing electric circuits in science! We will continue to learn about the characteristics of light,

Our mathematicians have been busy solving equations with variables, and will work with decimals and fractions through December. Be on the lookout for the annual science project packet .
