



Return to In-Person Instruction Newsletter | JUNE 2021

Dear NPS Families:

We are excited to announce that Norfolk Public Schools is ready to return to in-person instruction 5 days per week for the 2021 - 2022 school year! After navigating such an unprecedented year, there have been many lessons learned regarding school division operations and instructional practices. As we transition to a full in-person schedule for students in the fall, students and families can expect the following:

- NPS will continue to follow the most current health and safety guidance from the Virginia Department of Health (VDH) and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), which currently includes mask-wearing, physical distancing, routine sanitization, and other common risk-mitigation measures. *This is subject to change should updated guidance be released prior to the start of the new school year*.
- Bell schedules will return to their normal, five-day, full-length times. Although there may be a need for concurrent instruction in limited instances, it will no longer serve as the format for how division-wide classroom instruction will be provided.
- NPS strengthened its commitment to all students' social and emotional learning (SEL) during the pandemic, and this support will continue to ensure that students are being provided access to positive learning experiences.
- The Virtual Scholars Academy (VSA) remains available for eligible students who will be in grades 4-12 next school year. Parents/Guardians who are interested in this option for their child(ren) must apply by no later than **June 14, 2021**. The VSA program has full course offerings to include services and accommodations for students with disabilities as determined by students' Individualized Education Plan (IEP) or Section 504 team. In response to Governor Ralph Northam's recent announcement (effective May 28, 2021) calling for the easing of distancing and capacity restrictions as it relates to COVID-19, Norfolk Public Schools has made plans to move in-person graduation ceremonies from S.B. Ballard Stadium at Old Dominion University (ODU) to the Chartway Arena. ODU is working with NPS to ensure that all mitigation protocols are followed so that graduates and their families can celebrate as safely as possible and experience a memorable occasion.

Graduating seniors will be issued 10 tickets each. With this move to Chartway Arena, we will follow the established original graduation rehearsal and ceremony schedules, as published on our <u>2020-2021 Academic Calendar</u>.
