They may also learn about financial aid options and the college admissions processes. They will be exposed to career opportunities that may be available to them after graduation with an emphasis on study skills and coursework pathways to prepare them for entry into the workforce.</p> <p>*English Learners who are in need of credit recovery or need to earn more course credits toward graduation are encouraged to attend the regular high school summer school where they can receive additional English language support.</p>
