High School – grades 9-12	
Program Goal: Students will continue to increase their English proficiency and specific academic language skills while also exploring post-secondary options with a focus on college and career readiness pathways.	
Students will learn about which courses and extra-curricular activities will prepare them for graduation and post-secondary study. They may also learn about financial aid options and the college admissions processes. They will be exposed to career opportunities that may be available to them after graduation with an emphasis on study skills and coursework pathways to prepare them for entry into the workforce.
