RESULTS SUMMARY

1466 respondents | Jan 2019

- •40% parents, proportional response by grade level (47% ES, 22% MS, 31% HS)
- •40% teachers
- •10% students, mostly HS
- •10% "Other"

Open to Change

- •All respondent groups had a higher than 50% agreement rate that later start times would be beneficial to the health, safety, and wellbeing of students & academic performance
- •59% total respondents approved of moving from $4 \rightarrow 3$ staggers. All staff 50%+ approval.
- HS parents @ 61% w/ 11% undecided, MS parents @ 56%, ES parents @ 48%
- MS parents @ 56% w/ 18% undecided. ES parents @ 48%
- •ES parents @ 48% w/ 19% undecided

| Transportation Impact | Reduction from 593-> 459 bus runs in the a.m. & 689-> 463 in the p.m. Significantly cut longest run times (120 mins->40 mins). Earliest pick up time would be ~7 a.m. (currently 5:30 a.m.). Would be able to staff all needed positions (currently need 230 positions and have 175 drivers which would be sufficient in Options A1-2). MS start times not impacted. Fleet reduction; lower operational & capital costs. | Same as A1 | Similar impact but not as efficient due to p.m. busing challenges of HS students being bussed home prior to MS. Increased bussing need for HS who would not be on the same time schedule as regional divisions. (note, these would change once lighting is in place). | Same as B1 |
