## **Mandatory Orientation**

Monday – Friday

Orientation will be held by appointment only. Please call the school to schedule your appointment.

Only the parent(s)/legal guardian(s) [max. 2 parents] and the enrolling student may attend orientation.

Participation in an Orientation session is required for all Madison students and a parent/legal guardian.

- 1. The student
- 2. Current Photo ID
- 3. Proof of Address
- 4. Medication Authorization Form (if applicable – all student medications must be delivered to the school by the parent and given directly to the school nurse or designee)

# <u>Enrollment</u>

Once all required documentation from the home school is received and the Orientation session is completed, students fully dressed in the approved school uniform will be enrolled, provided with a school schedule, and begin attending classes.

# **Uniform Policy**

*Restorative Practices* is fostering healthy relationships and promoting positive discipline in schools.

*After-school Remediation* programs are available throughout the school year.
