**SMART Goal:** By the end of the 2023-2024 school year, 100% of English students will show at least 10% growth in critical thinking skills as measured on English Common Formative Assessments, End-of-Course Assessments, and AP Tests.

9 grade- 100% of students will score 35 SPG or higher on the Star Reading Assessment as measured in April 2024.

The English SOL Test in May 2024

- the pass rate of the black subgroup will increase from 85.66% to 90% on the SOL test in May 2024.
- the pass rate of SWD will increase from 80.95% to 85% on the SOL test administered in May 2024.
- the pass rate of economically disadvantaged students will increase from 87.61% to 90% on the SOL test administered in May 2024.
- the pass rate of EL students will increase from 70.37% to 75% on the SOL test administered in May 2024.

Students taking the Advanced Placement English Language Test in May will increase the overall qualifying scores from 53.4 % to 60%.

Students taking the Advanced Placement English Literature Test in May will increase the overall qualifying scores from 83.3 % to 85%.

**Essential Action/ Evidence-based Intervention/Research-based Strategy:** Staff, teachers, and administration will set high expectations for student achievement and improve academic excellence for all students by frequent monitoring of student progress.

<u>Root Cause Analysis:</u> Overall, the root cause analysis is students' students dropping out or attaining their GED. Of the students 51 students who did not test, 63% dropped out or got their GED. Another 16% of students are still enrolled. Seven students did not take the test due to attendance related issues. attendance. Thus, I would contribute a portion of the cause to communication to parents and students and follow up with sending students for makeup SOL assessments contribute to the participation rate.

**SMART Goal Statement:** By the end of the 2023-2024 school year, we will increase our federal participation rate for the 2024 cohort on the Reading SOL Test for all students from 93% to 95% and the following subgroups: Black students from 94% to 95%, economically disadvantaged students from 82% to 95%, Hispanic students from 91% to 95%, and White students from 89% to 95%.

<u>Student Measures:</u> 100% of students in the 2024 Cohort, who have not completed the Reading SOL test, will be identified, and test in January during the testing window. 100% of students in the 2025 Cohort will complete the Reading SOL test in May 2024.

<u>Staff Measures:</u> 100% of teachers on the English 11 and English 12 team will receive a list of eligible students for testing, and they will complete a log sharing any attendance concerns with the Assistant Principal (Testing Coordinator), and OTG.

Another 33% of students had parent refusals and 6 or 29% Seven students did not take the test due to attendance related issues. attendance. Thus, I would contribute a portion of the cause to communication to parents and students and follow up with sending students for makeup SOL assessments contribute to the participation rate.

**SMART Goal Statement:** By the end of the 2023-2024 school year, we will increase our federal participation rate for the 2024 cohort on Math SOL Tests for all students from 81% to 95% and the following subgroups: Black students from 82% to 95%, and Economically Disadvantaged students from 85% to 95%.

<u>Student Measures:</u> 100% of eligible students in all cohorts, who have not completed required Math SOL tests, will be identified, and test in January and May.

<u>Staff Measures:</u> 100% of teachers will be aware of testing and make up schedule. In addition, counselors, graduation coaches and math teachers will receive a list of eligible students for testing. The team will complete a log sharing any attendance concerns with the Assistant Principal (Testing Coordinator), and OTG.
