Virginia Pandemic Electronic Benefit Transfer (P-EBT) Program

2021-2022 School Year Eligibility Update

The Virginia Department of Social Services (VDSS) in partnership with the Virginia Department of Education has received approval from the United States Department of Agriculture to provide food assistance benefits through the P-EBT program for COVIDrelated student absences during the 2021-2022 school year.

Eligibility for benefits has changed due to federal requirements and the receipt of benefits for previous school years does not guarantee eligibility this school year. To qualify for benefits, a school and student must meet the following revised requirements:



The student's school must:

- Have closed or operated at reduced hours for five consecutive days due to a COVID-related issue
- and participate in the National School Lunch or School Breakfast Program.





The **student** must:

- Attend a school that has been determined eligible as defined by United States Department of Agriculture guidelines
- and qualify for free and reduced-price school meals,
- **3.** *and* have a documented absence from school due to COVID-related issue.

Eligibility for benefits will be determined by the information your child's school/school district provides to VDSS. Benefits will be issued retroactively to eligible students beginning May 25.
