If you are completing the packets, you can download them from the NPS website or pick up a packet from school. Since we are a distribution site, you don't have to make an appointment, you can pick up a hard copy anytime between 11am and 1pm Monday, Wednesday or Friday.

Once you complete a packet, hang on to it! Don't lose it! We are still working on when and how we are going to collect them. But, yes! All of this work will count.

Students and parents, also know you can keep working with your teachers on make up work from before the closure. You can still bring your grades up. Work with your teachers; we want every single student in their next grade next year and excelling to their best potential.

If you pick up your packet during one of the pickup times, you won't need an appointment, but if you need medicine or other essential items, you will need one. Appointment times are Tuesdays and Thursdays between 10am and 2pm – email me to set that up. My email is on our school website and the first email on our staff directory.

Attention eighth graders, email you counselors to complete high school planning if you have not already done so. The email addresses are on the staff directory on the school website.
