

Promotion Requirements

Grade 9 to 10: To be classified a tenth grader, a student must earn at least five (5) course credits at the end of 9th.

<u>Grade 10 to 11</u>: To be classified an eleventh grader, a student must earn at least ten (10) course credits at the end of 10th grade, including 2 credits in English and 1 credit in Math.

<u>Grade 11 to 12</u>: To be classified a twelfth grader, a student must earn at least fifteen (15) course credits at the end of 11th grade, including three credits in English and two (2) credits in Math.

How to Calculate your GPA, Weighted Credit, the Grading Scale and Other

Grades are on all students' minds! Grades and credits go hand-in-hand...credits and semester grades are awarded only twice a year at the end of each semester. Interim grades are a progress report to let you know how you are doing up to that point in each marking period. Granby's GPA and class rank are based on a 4.0 scale. A cumulative GPA of 3.0 is necessary for a student to be an honor graduate. GPAs are recalculated near the start and at the end of each school year. Grades earned in Advanced Placement (AP) or IB courses receive a weighted factor of .06 at the end of the year, while all honors and pre-IB courses receive a weighted factor of .0250. Weighted credit is added to your overall (cumulative GPA)GPA. Weighted courses are identified by an "H" or "A" to the left of the course code on the Norfolk Public Schools Credit Sheet (Transcript). To calculate your unweighted semester GPA, add the GPA values for each of your final grades and divide it by the number of courses you've taken.

This sample shows regular level classes. If you are taking Honors or AP classes, then you would add the weighted credit AFTER calculating the GPA. So, if this sample student had taken AP Biology, instead of Biology, .06 would be added to 2.8375 making the GPA 2.8975. If this sample student also took Honors English 10, you would add .0250 to the total, making the GPA with Honors and AP weighted credit 2.9225. It may sound confusing, but it's really not...try a sample calculation and see for yourself!
