Overview of Fifth Grade STAR Results in Reading

Strengths: Our fifth graders have a strong understanding of nonfiction text features, and basic story elements.

Students need additional support in identifying homophones and structural patterns found in nonfiction text.

During small groups, students will be reviewing skills/strategies and applying them while reading passages independently.

Curriculum Corner

Reading 5.5 b, c, e-k, 5.6 a-j, — In reading, students will be working on comprehension of fiction and nonfiction.

Social Studies VS 10.a,b,c— Students will be learning the 3 branches of Virginia's state government and modern products and industries. In addition, the advancement of communication, transportation and technology.

Science 5.5 – I can describe similarities and differences between a plant and animal cell. I can identify plants as either vascular or nonvascular. I can identify animals as either invertebrates or vertebrates. Math 5.9, 5.11,.12a, 12.b, 5.13a,b— We will be working on identifying and describing the diameter, radius, chord, and circumference of a circle. Students will also classify and measure angles and triangles.
