Begin with a self-assessment...


Review the graduation criteria. You should know your diploma type and what you need to satisfy the MINIMUM requirements. You should also know how many verified credits (SOLs) your diploma type will require you to earn...do you have the number needed? If not, it is YOUR responsibility for making plans to ensure you'll be eligible for testing.

Know your GPA...meaning cumulative GPA which covers all grades earned for high school credit bearing classes... You may have earned some in middle school too.

Sign-up to take your SATs this spring.

Prepare a resume of all your extracurricular activities during high school, including community service, sports, work, travel and awards.

Finally, compare your profile with the profiles of students already attending colleges where you might apply... See where you fall within the range of current students. ADMISSIONS OFFICERS FROM CHRISTOPHER NEWPORT UNIVERSITY; THE COLLEGE OF WILLIAM AND MARY; THE UNIVERSITY OF ALABAMA AND VIRGINIA COMMONWEALTH UNIVERSITY WILL PARTICIPATE IN A PANEL DISCUSSION ABOUT THE ADMISSION PROCESS AND APPLICATION REVIEW. . IT'S NOT TOO EARLY TO BEGIN CONSIDERING WHICH COLLEGES YOU MIGHT BE INTERESTED IN ATTENDING.

- Check out how your academic stats compare with accepted students. On most college websites this is usually called the "freshman profile."
- Do some online college searches. The College Board website has an excellent search tool to help you begin this process.
- Take some road trips to visit different campuses. Try to envision yourself on the campus. If possible, it's a good idea to try and arrange to spend the night in a dorm.
- Parents & students need to talk about what factors are most important in identifying "the right" college. The discussion may include both the size of the actual campus and the student body; the average class size and who teaches the classes; the college location: rural or urban setting, in the north versus in the south, mountains versus coastal, the distance from home; the programs of study offered; public versus private; in-state versus out-of-state; or, the cost of attendance...to name but a few.

Don't be surprised if the two lists of priorities are very different...
