Our Instructional Focus Statement

At Granby High School, we will improve students' critical thinking skills through use of Kagan and cooperative learning strategies with JIGSAW, FISHBONE, and RECIPROCAL TEACHING as high yield strategies.

Looking at Student Work and Owning Our Data

Students should see exemplary student work (for current units of study) as well as data posted in classes and on the halls throughout the building. Students should maintain unit test data forms in each class to track their progress and to set learning goals.

Kagan and Cooperative Learning Strategies Implementation with Fidelity


Students should participate in Kagan and/or cooperative learning strategies in each class on a daily basis. Students should complete JIGSAW, FISHBONE, and RECIPROCAL TEACHING strategies in each class for each unit of study!

Reading and Writing to Improve Literacy

Every student should engage in focused and/or sustained silent reading activities on a daily basis in every class. Every ninth and tenth grader should be using a writing structure to develop persuasive writing responses in English and Health classes at least 4 times each quarter.

Goal for Improving Attendance

Chronic student absenteeism will be reduced by at least 10% (from 20% to 10%) in order to meet school accreditation in the area of attendance.

QUARTER 1 REFLECTIONS BASED ON SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT GOALS BY DEPARTMENT

I have listed reflections from each department regarding our work as it aligns to our goals in the school improvement plan. Please take a moment to review. In cases where someone may feel uncomfortable, I have redacted identities.

English Department Quarter 1 Review

- We have conducted two rounds of SOL and WorkKeys writing remediation through Powercode classes and with Ms. Secrest.
- 42/50 students passed the WorkKeys and/or the Writing SOL retake.

 Josephine Watts will visit Eng. 9-11 team meetings this week to assist with data analysis.
- *100 English 10 students will head to Staunton to see production of As You Like It.
- Five English teachers attended AP Language and Literature training on Nov. 5th.

History Department Quarter 1 Review

Pass rates in SOL tested courses from the latest unit test:

- World Geography- 63% overall, 25% for SPED, The overall goal is 70%
- World History I- 72% overall, 26% for SPED, The goal is 85%
- World History II- 87% overall, the goal is 100%
- VA/U.S. History- 66% overall, 41% for SPED, The goal is 80%

Pass Rates in AP classes from the latest unit test:

- AP Psychology- 64%
- AP U.S. History- 52%
- AP Human Geography-73%
- AP Government- 82%
- The planning teams have been developing strategies to help students analyze documents and write PBAs. They are a work in progress. All of the planning teams began the grading process together to ensure everyone is using the rubric properly and consistently. The U.S. History team met with Mrs. Lopez to ensure they were scoring PBAs appropriately. A portion of the October department meeting was spent developing teaching strategies for PBAs. As many teachers have not taught writing before, this is a new challenge.
- Grading the PBAs is a time-consuming process, it took a teacher 6 hours to score all 6 of her classes. This does not include individually entering each student's component score in Schoolnet, which took the teacher an additional 90 minutes.

- Each teacher is implementing Jigsaw at least once per unit. Mr. Lynch, a new teacher, and Mr. Dunkley have received professional development on Jigsaw, among other teaching strategies.
- Teachers received professional development on *Explicit Instruction* at the September department meeting.
- Teachers are implementing review as warm-ups daily.
- Mr. Lynch and Mr. Hill have received professional development training on implementing vocabulary strategies into their SOL courses. Mrs. Goodman is planning on implementing vocabulary into her cotaught classes.
- Mr. Hill and Mr. Lynch have received training on questioning strategies (warm and cool calling).
- Mr. Lambert and Mr. Schmitt attended the AP workshop Monday, November 5th.
- Mr. Lemieux and Mr. Hill attended a workshop on using Primary Sources last week. Mr. Lemieux also attended an Advanced GIS workshop October 24th.

Science Department Quarter 1 Review

The Science Teachers are working on the Tasks/Strategies.

- At least 2 Kagan structures are being used and stated in the lesson plans
- Daily scientific reading of articles, graphs, charts and tables are being used
- Data minutes and analysis are being recorded
- Data binders are being kept for students
- Formal and informal observation notes are being recorded
- The test data is showing that the teachers need to continue to remediate content learned thus far.

Health and Physical Education Department Quarter 1 Review

HPE School Improvement Plan Update

Performing and Fine Arts Department Quarter 1 Review

- Each unit of instruction (in Art) addresses one (or more) section of the assessment tool.
- Daily use of Kagan strategies (specifically jigsaw) are found in every music class.
- One (or more) Kagan strategies are implemented in each unit of art instruction.
- The art department currently has 26 students artwork on display (Military Circle Mall) which meets 25% of our goal to date.

Foreign Language Department Quarter 1 Review

Goal: To align assessments to meet the needs of all students/subgroups.

- <u>Strategy</u>: Use student data to identify and differentiate instruction and assessment to meet the needs of the following subgroups: On-level, modified (to include SPED), above level/pre-AP, and heritage speakers
 - Teachers are using student self-assessment forms to drive remediation and individualize reteaching strategies.
 - Teachers analyze assessment data to determine areas of weakness, which are recycled into warmups and online practice activities.
 - Teachers use pre-assessments to differentiate instruction and assessments to meet the needs of all levels of learners.
 - o Teachers provide enrichment for above level and heritage learners.

Goal: To continue to incorporate cooperative learning activities into instruction.

- <u>Strategies</u>: Kagan strategies to include Jigsaw, Fishbone, Reciprocal Teaching, Sustained Silent Reading, and others specific to target language use and acquisition.
 - o Teachers incorporate a variety of Kagan strategies into lesson plans.
 - Teachers use Focused Reading to introduce grammar and cultural topics and to enhance reading comprehension in the target language.
 - o Teachers use Jigsaw to "chunk" reading and incorporate collaborative learning/presentation skills.

Goal: To assess proficiency of students by using Integrated Performance Assessments (IPAs)

 Teachers assess students in a variety of ways, including PBAs where students are required to use the fours skills of language acquisition separately, and IPAs with reading/writing listening/speaking.

<u>Goal</u>-Students with disabilities: To adjust instruction, practice, and assessments to meet the needs of students with disabilities

- Strategies: Implement accommodations from IEP/504 plans. Utilize modified assessment practices
 - o Teachers implement accommodations from IEPs/504 plans with fidelity.
 - Teachers modify instruction, assignments, and assessment practices to allow students with disabilities to achieve an appropriate level of success in target language acquisition.

Career and Technical Education Department Quarter 1 Review

Quarter 1 Updates:

- All CTE Teachers will complete VDOE CTE Student Competency Report on each student
 - o VDOE CTE Student Competency Reports became available November 1, 2018.
- At least 1 Competency is covered daily, even when substitutes are present
- CTE Industry Certification results: **Pre-Test:** October 7, 2018
- 90% of CTE Teachers are using Jigsaw, Fishbone and Reciprocal Teaching Strategies to begin units and review vocabulary. Quiz-Quiz-Trade is also being used for review.
- CTE Teachers are working with student's Case Managers to ensure 100% of students work towards meeting the required VDOE CTE Student Competency Report and show at least 10% growth in critical thinking skills. Mrs. Wactor is being copied on all email correspondence.

Next Steps

- Work with new CTE Teachers to raise 90% to 100% of CTE Teachers are using Jigsaw, Fishbone and Reciprocal Teaching Strategies to begin units and review vocabulary. Quiz-Quiz-Trade is also being used for review.
- November 19th: Observe all new teachers. Have a planning session with Mrs. Madigan, CTE Specialist and Marketing teachers (Williams, Crespo, and Dandridge) to have each course aligned with each teacher.
