BOOKER T. WASHINGTON HIGH SCHOOL PHASE 1 FEASIBILITY STUDY RESOLUTION WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 18, 2019

- WHEREAS, the current Booker T. Washington High School opened in September 1974 at the cost of just 8 million dollars,
- **WHEREAS,** Booker T. Washington High School has a long and rich history in this the City of Norfolk and in the Commonwealth of Virginia,
- **WHEREAS,** Booker T. Washington High School is one of two remaining Historically Black High Schools in the Commonwealth,
- WHEREAS, over the past decade, Booker T. Washington High School's enrollment has decreased to an average of 970 students,
- **WHEREAS,** in 2018 The School Board of the City of Norfolk voted to maintain the present location and name of Booker T. Washington High School,
- WHEREAS, a comprehensive study of the school's academic programs and how they align with the current physical structure has not been conducted since the opening of the existing structure in 1974,
- **WHEREAS,** it is critically important to ensure that all five of Norfolk High Schools have an active and academically challenging Academy program,
- WHEREAS, it is the desire of the school and surrounding community to ensure that Booker T. Washington High School has a vibrant and competitive Academy that will retain and attract a diverse group of students from across the city,
- **WHEREAS,** it is vitally important to include this action into the overall facility planning and funding for Norfolk Public Schools,
- **Whereas,** it is essential to bring stakeholders together to provide input into what the future academic program has instore for Booker T. Washington High School;
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Norfolk City School Board includes in its FY 2020-2021 Budget funding to complete a Phase 1 Feasibility Study for Booker T. Washington High School and present that report by February 2021 to the School Board and Stakeholders for future action.
