Read this before you print! Front/back printing recommended. If you don't have front/back printing capabilities, it will be fine one sided (or you can put two pages together {back-to-back} when you laminate it to make it front/back).


Printing tip: make sure you have your front/back printing settings set to flip on the long edge or long edge binding.


Assembly instructions: <u>Print pages 3-22 front/back</u>. Print pages 23 (front only). Laminate the book pages and bind on the long edge. Cut out and laminate picture symbols. Attach a scratchy velcro dot to the blank boxes on the book pages and 2 to each basket (velcro guides are included on the pages). Attach a soft velcro dot to the back of the picture symbols. Store the picture symbols on the book pages they correspond with.


Additional materials needed: A dry erase marker or overhead marker to mark the shopping lists.


How to use: This book was designed for PK-K and special education classrooms. Read the book (have the student read along with the adapted sentences). Have the student find the correct food items and put them in the basket. After each page there is a shopping list and the student has to place an X (with a dry erase marker) in the box next to the food items they just found. After all of the food items are found there are two more pages of a reinforcement activity. The student has to find the correct food category and match it to the food. I use this to target sorting, functional vocabulary, categorization, object identification, following directions, and increasing MLU.






























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
