School Meals at No Charge for All Children

Effective immediately, Norfolk Public Schools will be serving meals at no charge to children 18 and under. The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has approved waivers for local school divisions and other federal meal program sponsors to implement the Summer Food Service Program to provide meals to children in the community free of charge through December 31, 2020. The waivers support access to nutritious meals while minimizing exposure to COVID-19.

When the Summer Food Service Program ends, meals for the remainder of the school year will be available free of charge to all Norfolk Public Schools students through the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) of the National School Lunch Program. Meals are available to all enrolled students including those learning in-person or virtually. No meal program applications are needed.
